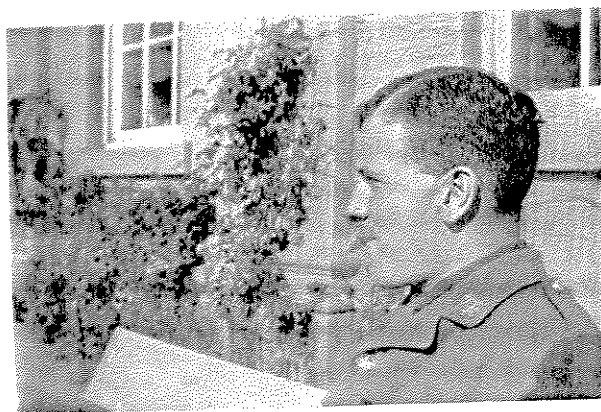

Lieutenant Cowan is the elder son of Mr. R. Cowan, of Orton Park, Carlisle. He entered Sandhurst in 1912, and was gazetted to the Highland Light Infantry in September, 1913. He served for a year in India, and on the outbreak of war sailed to France with his regiment. He was promoted lieutenant on November 14th, 1914, and took an active part in the operations at Givenchy in December, 1914. He was present at Neuve Chapelle (where he was mentioned in despatches), the second battle of Ypres, and was wounded at Richebourg, where he was again mentioned in despatches.
