I will send it to you when I can get a registered letter. If I can't I shall keep it until I come on leave as I live in New Hall St. Pendleton. We were in the line and Fritz was sniping at us. He said to me I'll shift him. So he went and? him out of the line. I know he killed two and what could ran for their lives but a sniper was in the roof of a house close by. Mr.Ackerley was a good soldier and I was sorry to lose him but I hope its not long before he is better and please remind me to him when you visit. Pte.J.E.Roberts, No 45316, 11 Batt. Lancs.
