Dear Sir,

"Special Constabulary Long Service Medal."

I am glad to inform you that His Majesty the King has been pleased to award you the "Special Constabulary Long Service Medal" for services rendered in the East Riding as a Special Constable during the War, and I take this opportunity of adding my grateful thanks to you for coming forward and willingly giving your assistance to the local Police at a time when help was greatly needed.

The following is an extract from the Secretary of State's letter received at this Office.

"In view of the great pressure at present existing in the manufacture of war medals the Secretary of State fears that it may be some time before it will be possible to issue the Medal and Bar, but I am to say that the Special Constables to whom the Medal has been awarded are authorized to wear the ribbon of the Medal forthwith."

A short length of the Ribbon is therefore enclosed herewith. When not affixed to the medal, only 1 inch of it should be worn, on the left breast.
